"There are many aspects to these artists and their work that intrigue me. They somehow address the deeper tissue of existence in their approach and process, without trying too hard to label or overly explain the elements of what they create. Each work exists somewhere between pattern and flow, possessing an elemental quality which compels the viewer towards understanding that what is seen is only skin-thick representation of a visual mnemonic, which asks not to be questioned but accepted" Sinead Smyth

### Jacinta O'Reilly

Jacinta is strongly influenced by abstract expressionists and the spontaneity of their process. "I enjoy using mixed media and layering drawings with various geometric shapes. It is the repetition of the shape that is important, so it becomes impossible to tell the beginning or the end of the drawing. I use the intensity of circles or triangles to compose an image giving an illusion of infinity. I am mindful of preserving a natural flow when I draw so that each component is considered but not deliberate. It is the wondrous and magnificent patterning of shapes and colours in nature that inspires my work."

### Sash Ka Sheils

Sash Ka is based in the North-West of Ireland. Her interest in art has come about through her desire to express that which is not meant to be expressed through words. Through her love of philosophy, her extensive work in the field of Occupational Therapy and Psychotherapy, and her formidable drive to be free to sculpt her own choices and her own destiny, Sash Ka has cultivated a bold uncompromising style.





# **Painting the Canvas** by Maria Svensson & Echo Echo Dance Theatre Company *Sat 28th January* | 12noon & 4pm | Tickets £5 / £3

Have you ever considered the essence you bring when you enter a room? What is left when you leave? Does it have colour, does it have sound? Does it make you move?

Painting the Canvas explores listening and moving with and without crayons. It includes projection and atmospheric sounds that ignite moments of colourful and playful imagination.

The piece features Echo Echo Ensemble artist Tonya Sheina with her daughters Dara Sheina-Batts (11yrs) and Mira Sheina-Batts (8yrs) and Echo Echo Ensemble artist Ayesha Mailey with her daughter Naya Duffy (7yrs). It also features multi-instrumentalist musicians Amanda Koser and Stephanie Pawula, and original lighting design by Barry Davis. Audiences young and old are welcome join in a fun movement session after the performance.

### **Figments** by **Kelly Quigley**

Exploring the idea that imagination is the bridge between our internal & external worlds, weaving itself seamlessly through past, present and future, driving creativity, filling the gaps in memory and creating endless possibilities through movement, song and spoken word. The performance celebrates femininity, nature and the arts and aligns with Imbolc, honouring the triple goddess Brigit.

Figments is performed by members of Body Wisdom. This award-winning group have been meeting for dance and movement classes and intensives led by Kelly Quigley and guest artists for over seven years. The group have performed both site-specifically and in regional venues and spaces.

### **'Out There'** by **Sighile Hennessy**

Out There is a 30 minute dance theatre performance created by Sighile Hennessy under the direction of Steve Batts with the creative support of Cindy Cummings. Sighile invites you to join her as she dances through time and space in an exploration of memory and imagination. Out There began before the COVID-19 pandemic and has been developed at both KCAT Arts Centre in Callan, County Kilkenny and at Echo Echo Studios in Derry. In October 2022, Sighile was invited to perform Out There as a part of the inaugural BODY MOVES International Inclusive Dance Festival at Sibikwa Arts Centre in Johannesburg, South Africa.

"Ireland's Sighile Hennessy invited the audience into her solo exploration of memory and imagination in Out There. Here there is a poignant sense of loneliness and heartache, as she sets up the picnic to which nobody comes. It is an introspective work, channelling an internal pondering on loss" Tammy Ballantyne - The Ar(t)chive, Johannesburg SA

Sighile Hennessy is a performer, mover, theatre-artist and founder-member of KCAT Arts Centre's Equinox Theatre Company. ### 'Nomad' by Cindy Cummings

Nomad is a solo experiment in presence, storytelling, celebrating habits, asking questions and not necessarily looking in the right place for the answers. A real time peripatetic. A moving conversation.

Cindy Cummings is a dance artist (choreographer/performer/tutor) whose practice integrates dance, theatre and live art. Since 1986 she has created collaborative works with dance, theatre, visual, sound, literary and media artists around the world for live performance, installation and film.

## equilibrium - Emily Welther & Daniel Brandl

Sat 4th February | 8pm | Tickets £8

In a structured improvised setting between a dancer and a musician, this piece dissolves the boundaries between movement and sound, between the seen and the heard by experimenting with an equilibrium of the senses. As a continuation of their live-streamed work, I N T E R F A C E, equilibrium brings the sounds of physical and emotional, acoustic and digital movement into an audio-visual-landscape. The artists join the mediums of dance, performance, and acoustic/electronic music, exploring sound as vibrations that result from the contact between bodies.

Over the past three years, Welther and Brandl have explored the binaural effects and possibilities of digitally-produced and live-mixed sounds in their live-streaming performances. Their separate practices evolve and merge into multiple ways of listening: through and with the body, as a sensory experience beyond that which is heard with the ears, and out of the urgent need to de-prioritize the visual, the known and the seen. This piece takes their digital and live-streaming work into a live event with shared sonic experiences and physically felt vibrations. They ask, how can an equilibrium be established between the senses, and might it then expand and alter the audible and visual boundaries of me and you?

### Ultan O'Brien & Nic Gareiss

Fiddler, violist, and composer Ultan O'Brien (Slow Moving Clouds) and percussive dancer Nic Gareiss (This is How we Fly) perform a set of new collaborations exploring space, time, and texture in Irish traditional music and percussive dance. Ultan and Nic create sound and movement at the nexus of sight, sound, and touch, puckishly exploring what fiddle music and step dance reveal about both predetermined and extemporaneous composition. By engaging mimetically: fiddle, fiddler, and fiddling, dance, dancer, and dancing, the duo reimagines the erotic symbiosis of traditional music and dance through historic repertoire and new encounter via the mediums of sound and gesture.

Ultan O'Brien & Nic Gareiss' 2023 appearances resume the duo's decade-long commitment to discovering and deepening a lexicon of collaboration which, among other revelations, reconsiders movers as soundmakers and recasts fiddlers as dancers, not only as a means to highlight these respective practices and repertoires, but ultimately to centre rapport. "Nic Gareiss is one of *Dance Magazine's "25 to Watch"*, dancer, musician, and dance researcher Nic Gareiss (he/they) has been hailed by the New York Times for his "dexterous melding of Irish and Appalachian dance" and called "the most inventive and expressive step dancer on the scene" by the Boston Herald. In 2020 Nic received the Michigan Heritage Award, the state's highest distinction bestowed on traditional artists."

"Ultan O'Brien (he/him) is a fiddle player, violist and composer hailing from County Clare drawing from a rich background in traditional Irish music and improvised music. Ultan records, performs and tours traditional and contemporary Irish music as a soloist and with a number of groups including: Irish/Finnish folk group, Slow Moving Clouds, Irish folk band Skipper's Alley, Scottish/Irish/Manx collaboration Aon Teanga:Un Çhengey, John Francis Flynn, and duos with Eoghan Ó Ceannabháin and Nic Gareiss. Ultan plays a Michiel de Hoog violin thanks to the support of the Music Capital Scheme and the Department of Culture, Heritage and the Gaeltacht, Music Network and the Irish Arts Council."

### **Public Workshop Programme**

## Emily Welther & Daniel Brandl Ways of Listening

Fri 3rd February 10am - 1pm Open to all levels of experience

In this workshop, we will be exploring different ways of listening, through the movement of the body as it relates to and travels through its surroundings, and as it comes into contact with musical instruments and objects. We will listen as the moving body brushes against the walls, knocks on windows, and treads on the floor of the room it is in, and begin to perceive the inner vibrations of its organs, bones and voice. This attention to an internal/ external listening and sound-making will be explored as well by the musicians as they create sounds with their instruments and their bodies. Questions we will ask are: What is rhythm/What is my rhythm? How do I want to move and what sounds do I want to make when I listen to what is in/outside of me? What happens when I focus my attention onto what I hear and how I feel? In a continuous feedback loop, the participants will interchange the roles of movers and sound-makers and create a space of multisensorial listening. Open to dancers, musicians, movers, and sound-makers of all levels. You are welcome to bring your own instruments or other sound-making devices.





## Nic Gareiss & Ultan O'Brien Dance the Tune

Sat 11th February 1pm - 2.15pm for dancers ages 12+

Traversing intersections and interstices of many clog, step, and percussive dance styles, this class explores the sheer musical potential of your feet. Using imitation and idiomatic ornaments as well as extended techniques for shoe sounds and textures, we will learn to construct lines of rhythm imitating melody as well as create rhythmic counterpoint by setting up shoe-grooves and developing listening, responsiveness, and sonic sensing. Wear smooth-soled comfortable shoes with a low or no heel for this class.
